

ATTENDING THE JOAN

The Joan is a registered COVID Safe venue and we are now operating under strict new guidelines. Your health and safety is our priority.

In accordance with NSW Health regulations, The Joan is operating at 75% of capacity from 7 December 2020. The easing of restrictions includes the removal of physical distancing requirements in seated indoor venues.

All tickets sold from Friday 11 December 2020 will not be physically-distanced from other audience members. If your ticket was purchased prior to this date, and the easing of physical distancing is problematic for you, please get in touch by email boxoffice@penrith.city or phone (02) 4723 7600.

All staff and visitors (12 years and older) must wear masks inside The Joan. Please bring a mask with you for entry. All staff and visitors must register their attendance on site using the QR Codes located near the entry points. Staff are available for assistance, and a manual option is available for those unable to register online.


Our Box Office is on the ground floor, at the Westfield end, near the bar and the lift.
